

LESSON 6 Verb Modifier Were/Was & ALL/MOST/SOME/ANY/NONE

EXAMPLES USING Verb Modifier Were/Was to create a continuous past tense

They, You WERE - WERE NOT - WEREN'T

It, He, She, I WAS - WAS NOT WASN'T

VERB	Using Past Tense "ed" or irregular verb past tense	Using Were/Was modifier and Present continuing "ing" to create a "Past Continuing"
Ask	Yesterday he asked about the English course.	Yesterday he was asking about the English course.
Throw	Yesterday he threw the ball really high.	Yesterday he was throwing the ball really high.
Blow	Yesterday they blew whistle very hard.	Yesterday they were blowing the whistle very hard.
Build	Earlier today you built a nice report.	Earlier today you were building a nice report.
	Last night I flew back from Australia (irregular verb fly)	Last night I was flying back from Australia.
Now allowing the past Continuing to "set the scene" (make the background for the story) for the next event that happened (and completed) in the past during that time.		
Eat	She ate a cake last night.	Last night she was eating a cake.
Eat (See)		Last night she was eating a cake when she saw her friend.
Study	They studied for the exam.	They were studying for the exam.
Study (run)		They were studying for the exam when their father ran in!
Walk (hit)	He walked in the park yesterday.	He was walking in the park yesterday when he was hit by a ball.
Built (ask)	He built a house yesterday.	He was building a house yesterday when he asked me the question.
Change (run)	They Changed the light bulb this morning.	They were changing the light bulb this morning when the dog ran into the house.
	Now using a -ve DID NOT DID'NT Need to use the BASE VERB	
Walk (hit)	They did not (walked) walk on the road. They didn't walk on the road.	They were not (weren't) walking on the road when they were hit by the car. They weren't walking on the road when they were hit by the car.
Run	I didn't Run in the park.	I wasn't running.
Run (see)		I wasn't running when I saw you
Hold	I didn't hold.	I was not holding.
Hold (break)		I wasn't holding the bowl when it broke
Talk (start)	I didn't talk.	I wasn't talking when the argument started.
Think (leave)	I didn't think.	I wasn't thinking when I left the door unlocked
